## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

In the space of 30 days, a member from Florida sent us a check for \$4,185.52, another member visiting from Oklahoma gave us a check for \$1,000 to fix the printer on the older reader/printer, at the Irish workshop a member handed me a check for \$500 as a match to the challenge program and we received notice that we were awarded a grant from Bravo Des Moines for \$1,500. Also within the same time period, a board member gave us \$2,850 to pay off one of our equipment lease/loans, saving us the monthly payment of \$455. All of this came at the time of the year when our funds traditionally run low since the largest influx of memberships come in the winter. I have put these people in the category of angels and I give thanks daily for them and others like them whose support keeps IGS running.

At the time I am writing this, we have been told that the check for the grant of \$15,000 from Polk County has been written and we should be receiving it very soon. At the Executive Committee meeting, it was decided that \$2,000 of the funds will be used to “buy down” the interest rate on our mortgage. The new, lower rate will be fixed for 5 years, rather than 3. We will have earned back the \$2,000 in less than 20 months because of the reduction in the interest we will be paying. State Savings Bank has been very helpful as we have worked through our financial issues.

June was a busy month at IGS for several reasons – the German Interest Group held its fifteenth conference and the Irish Interest Group held its first. Attendance at both was gratifying – there were over 100 attendees at the German conference and over 50 for the Irish. These are part of our effort to offer quality resources to genealogists in Iowa.

The Nominating Committee has just finished doing an outstanding job. For the first time in quite awhile, we will have almost a full slate of officers. We still have three regions open – the ballots will be mailed in mid-August and if you live in one of these regions, think seriously about being a write-in candidate.

I want to thank Denise Gripp of Indianola for stepping in and filling the position of First Vice President. She has taken on the planning of the Fall Conference with enthusiasm and her great ideas are translating into what will be a great conference. I hope to see lots of you there – this is your opportunity to hear a world-class speaker and add to your skills.

By now, you will have noticed that you are receiving the newsletter on a regular schedule of every other month. Cris Nagla has done a wonderful job of putting it together. She cracks the whip and strictly enforces the deadlines for those of us who submit items. I am writing this with one eye on the clock to be sure I meet the midnight deadline. I will send it off to her with over 2 hours to spare!

One last thing – we have a gremlin in our e-mail system that we can't seem to locate and rid ourselves of. When you send an e-mail to [igs@iowagenealogy.org](mailto:igs@iowagenealogy.org), it does get through to us. Ignore the notice from Concentric Host that says it wasn't delivered. Short of dynamite, our experts can't figure out how to fix the problem.

The Iowa Genealogical society issues certificates to persons who are directly descended from Iowa Pioneers. Applicants must prove that the ancestor settled in Iowa:

By 1846 to receive a Statehood Certificate  
By 1856 to receive a Pioneer Certificate  
More then 100 years to receive a Century Certificate

You can purchase these certificates for either yourself or others. The person to whom the certificate is issued need not live in Iowa. These certificates can make great gifts for family members. ### GERMAN INTEREST GROUP CONFERENCE UPDATE

As we reflect on our recent German conference, we wish to thank all who attended, and all our members who worked so diligently, to ensure its' success. This great effort enables us to continue our support of the Iowa Genealogical Society and the Library.

Our gift of the Ancestry.com subscription is being used with increasing frequency, especially by the vacationing researchers that we welcome in the summertime. The small fee being charged for it's use will, hopefully, cover the cost of next year's subscription.

We are pleased that the publisher has resumed printing the German Parish Records series, which we are purchasing for the Library collection; Volume 13 is now on the shelves, with several more scheduled to be printed in the future.

Various members of our group have shared their research success stories at our monthly meetings, which are very inspirational and instructional. One member even submitted his experiences, along with some great photos, to a genealogical publication, which accepted and printed the story. We invite others to share their experiences and knowledge in this manner.

Anyone wishing to learn about doing German research is welcome to attend our meetings held the 1<sup>st</sup> Monday evening of each month (excepting when it falls on a national holiday) at 7 PM at the Library.

## IGS CHAPTER NEWS

### MADISON COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY:

Volunteer members continue to add obituaries on line each day, as of July 5, they have over 17,246 obituaries on the Madison County website. Our project of taking photos of the gravestones in the Madison County cemeteries is drawing to a close for the first time around. There are still photos of the oldest section of the Winterset cemetery to be entered on line, they will be entered as time permits. We have started going back to the first cemeteries that were photographed in 2003 and taking new burial photos and updating the cemetery listings. As of July 3, 2007 we have 32,617 gravestone photos on line. A way of preserving the gravestones. Our big news this newsletter is that our county coordinators have just put the Madison County 1919 death index on line. We now have 1880 - 1919 death indexes on line. However there is a portion of 1904, all of 1905, 1906 and a portion of 1907 and 1919 that is missing. It is believed that the rest of 1904, all of 1905 and 1906 are in the State of Iowa collection. The MCGS will have a booth and will be exhibiting at the Madison County Fair, July 17th through July 22nd.

Theresa Liewer will be presenting a program at our August meeting on 'Immigration and Naturalization.' In September, Tim Waddingham will have program on the Madison County Courthouse Renovation, our October program will be 'Madison County History through Photos' by Gary and Shirley Allen, Tom McGarvey will give the program on 'Unusual Sources Where I Found Family Information'. Madison County Genealogy Society will be receiving a Volunteer Recognition Award, Monday, July 16th for the preparation of the Madison County probate and guardianship records through the year 1924 for micro filming by LDS. LDS is still in the process of filming the probate records, once they are completed, they will micro film the guardianships records. The members, who volunteered lots of hours, will be receiving a volunteer certificate. This is through the State Historical Library. Delpha Musgrave, from the Iowa State Historical Library, asked the genealogy society to prepare the records for micro filming. Delpha helped by making a alpha listing of names along with the probate numbers once we were able to get the files organized.

It goes to deep pride that they fought to make and keep us a Nation. It goes to a deep and immense understanding that they were doing it for us. That we might be born who we are. That we might remember them. So we do.

With love and caring and scribing each fact of their existence, because we are them and they are us. So, as a scribe called, I tell the story of my family. It is up to that one called in the next generation to answer the call and take their place in the long line of family storytellers.

That, is why I do my family genealogy, and that is what calls those young and old to step up and put flesh on the bones.
